As one of the founders of the NL OSAC Chapter, I am thrilled by what we have achieved throughout the past 30 years. In 1989 the project of establishing our OSAC Chapter for the Netherlands was initiated by the Embassy's Regional Security Office (RSO), along with the American Chamber of Commerce, and Dow Chemicals in Rotterdam. Our very first and well attended gathering of OSAC the Netherlands took place in the auditorium of the (old) American Embassy. The large number of participants enthusiastically voted in favor of continuing our new Chapter.

After this, the newly established Steering Board (AmCham, Dow, PanAm, TWA, ExxonMobil, IBM, RSO) organized its very first seminar at the Pulitzer Hotel in Amsterdam on November 28, 1990. Ever since then, OSAC NL has organized an annual event. In the very beginning the security related information was exchanged by telephone and fax message only. Can you imagine?

After the introduction of the computer, internet, and more recently, social media, our Chapter adjusted its methods of communication to adapt and thrive in a rapidly changing security environment, and to meet growing demands due to the globalization of conducting business. Additionally, the vision of OSAC the Netherlands moved from merely exchanging information about developments, to addressing and analyzing new trends, e.g. cybercrime, espionage, and business continuity. At the same time, the number of yearly events increased from one to four! Three seminars, and an annual end of year reception. Thanks to the hard work of our voluntary Steering Board, and the much-appreciated support of our Members, the OSAC Netherlands Chapter became one of most successful security organizations worldwide.

We are proud to have welcomed many highly distinguished and knowledgeable experts to our events. Our guest speakers always enjoy these occasions and the opportunity to discuss their topics at our seminars or receptions. Bob J. Whigham - Former RSO & Co-Founder

managed to launch our first and well attended seminar in Amsterdam. From what I can recall it was a challenging and also very pleasant time with mostly Dutch counterparts as representatives from American private businesses. Hans de Waal Malefijt – Former Chair



If I think about my days with OSAC, the first things that comes to my mind are the many initiatives we took in those days to bring security to a higher and more professional level. In many organizations security was considered to be a kind of ‘necessary evil’ and many of the security positions in smaller organizations were a secondary responsibility of HR Managers or Safety Coordinators. Only major organizations like Philips, KLM, Dutch Railways, the Oil Companies, The Netherlands Gasunie, DSM and Albert Heijn had security professionals in their organizations, and there were many activities initiated by this group to share expertise, experience and information amongst the rest of the security

community in the Netherlands. I’m thinking about the VBB (Vereniging Bedrijfs Beveiliging), ASIS (American Society for Industrial Security) and last but not least OSAC. I recall that one of my main challenges as an OSAC chairman was to bring these organizations together to optimize professionalism and the exchange of timely and effective security information. Since OSAC added a truly international aspect to the security world and also because of the fact that many American or US related organizations had strong links with the US Department of State in the commercial and political fields, security became more and more an ‘added value’ for these organizations.



Having said all this, the other thing that I remember of my time as an OSAC chairman was the group of great and dynamic individuals that I was privileged to work with, both at the US Embassy as well as the group of security professionals that formed the core group of the Dutch 'Security Environment'.

One of my standard routines during the very many business trips in my life with ExxonMobil was to visit the RSO at the US Embassy in each country I visited, and needless to say OSAC was the driving mechanism behind all this! It always felt like coming back home into the warm OSAC family!

Andre Delpout RSE – Former Chair



I joined the OSAC Netherlands Council in 1995, representing Centocor, a bio-pharmaceutical company with headquarters in Malvern, PA, USA.

I became chairman of the council in 1997, succeeding Carol Newell (TWA). At that time the Netherlands council used a facsimile communications tree to issue security warnings to American companies in the Netherlands. One board member would send a fax (!) to 10-15 council members. Six board members could easily cover all the OSAC members in the Netherlands. Obviously things have changed after the introduction of internet, e-mail, and other sorts of media.

Thinking back, these were special times. A lot happened both nationally and internationally. The world changed step by step and sometimes all at once. Eduard Emde – Former Chair



I remember with pride how the Dutch Country Council came about and how it had a role in dealing with challenges stemming from the first Gulf War. I had the pleasure of meeting some old hands who not only had a lot of knowledge, but also several anecdotes at the ready. They were all great colleagues and nice to work with too. Ebel Hidding is one of them who stands out.

The nineties were clearly different times with less restrictions and no great difficulty to enter the Embassy for the board meetings or council gatherings. Some of that has gone forever I fear. What I do not miss is the work that was required to keep the fax based notification trees running. At one moment I had the entire Amsterdam region as well as another one in my remit, and how different it was from the simple forwarding of an e-mail message...

I remember the great brainstorm sessions regarding themes and speakers. Over time, the meetings of the Council have provided great opportunities to meet and hear fascinating things from knowledgeable and sometimes unique or even famous speakers. The good networking opportunities and the great atmosphere have remained.

Over the years, the Board has surpassed its own high standards many times. Even better themes and speakers were presented. I am not surprised as this comes from a desire to always do better. I remember that there would be soul searching at times to come up with new themes and to find out what the constituents would really like to learn, hear and experience. And from time to time there would be a push to enlarge the group by one more, exploring whether more AmCham members would be interested, or working together with other specialized or generic security associations.

We should cherish the network and culture of this Country Council. There is a lot to be proud of!

In 2002, I was approached to take over the chairmanship for OSAC from Eduard Emde, then working at Estec. It was a great honor; back then my American employer, IBM Nederland B.V. was a warm supporter of the OSAC organization and my manager fully supported and encouraged our contribution to OSAC. In 2001 the terrible 9/11 attacks took place and the threat of terrorism became an important 'topic' for the business community. In the first year, we established an 'association' OSAC the Netherlands

with our OSAC team, including statutes and regulations, and which was officially notarized; we also registered with the Chamber of Commerce for tax reasons.

We organized educational meetings for which the resources of speakers were almost always unlimited due to the support of the Embassy's Regional Security Officer. There were many subjects in the years 2002-2014: pandemic threats, cybercrime, terrorism threat, and so on. All international, so extremely suitable for American multinationals. Every year the OSAC members were invited to the Ambassador's Residence for a New Year's Reception which was a highlight and great opportunity for networking. We tried to include all the speakers we had had in the past year; the Ambassador's staff always treated us to delicious snacks and drinks. In 2015 we celebrated the 25th Anniversary of OSAC. After 12 very interesting years, I handed over the chairmanship to Glenn Schoen. I look back on this valuable part of my career with great pleasure.
